A message from our Technology Centre at Waipawa School.....

Kia Ora CHB school community. I am after empty plastic bottles with lids! Ideal bottles include 600ml fizzy drink bottles and 500ml cream bottles. Smaller bottles such as 300ml are great too.

Ideally the bottle has a tapered design. I am after about 385 bottles! Please can you drop off clean bottles at your school and they will be delivered to the tech centre with the year 7 and 8 students on their next visit.

Why do I want plastic bottles? I am Laura Bridge, one of the tech teachers at Waipawa School. For our first project this year we are making fly fans. To reduce plastic waste going to landfill we would like to reuse rather than buying new ones. The bottles will house our electrical circuits and support the motor that will drive the fan.
