

Mrs Smith is also including DMIC (Developing Mathematic Inquiry Communities) collaborative practices into the math lessons as well as other areas of the curriculum to foster students working together successfully to solve problems.


Archie's school fleece has gone missing. Could you have a look and see if you have it by mistake? It is named. Archie was a bit cold on Tuesday afternoon!
